A special meeting of the Commissioners Court of Garza County, Texas was held on Tuesday, July 13, 2010 at 6:00 P.M., at the Wells Fargo Bank community room, Post, Texas with the following members present: Lee Norman, Judge; Commissioners: Pct. 1 - Gary McDaniel and Pct. 2- Charles Morris. Not present were Commissioners: Pct. 3- Ted Brannon and Pct. 4-Mike Sanchez.

Public official present was Jim Plummer, District and County Clerk.

Also present were USDA Wildlife Services representatives Rick Gilliland, Mark Crabb and Johnny Kemp, Borden County organizer Joel Dennis and eight interested Garza County ranchers/residents.

The informational meeting started at 6:00 P.M.

Order 1: Consider the possibility of developing a cost-share cooperative agreement for a wildlife damage control technician to assist Garza County.

Rick Gilliland, Canyon District Supervisor for the Texas Animal Damage Control Service showed a slide show presentation to the attendees that explained why the service exists and what it can do: including human health and safety, protection of livestock, property, crops, rangeland and wildlife. Garza County is in the Canyon District.

The cost per county is \$2200-2400/month. Funding can be blended with county and private money. The local cost is matched with a 55% state and federal funds to 45% local funds.

A field agreement by the local group is necessary to begin operation and the search for a technician. The hiring process is started through the state organization. Applicants are then narrowed down for local agency members to consider.


Private property owners must submit an agreement with the local agency that would fit their needs.

Joel Dennis explained that Borden County's program is now fully funded by the county. It started out being funded with private funds.

Judge Norman suggested setting another meeting and to invite more producers to attend and to provide more data to share to support the program.

No action was taken. (A printout of the slide presentation is attached.)


The meeting adjourned at 7:22 P.M.




